GENERAL ROSE SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **All exhibitors must pre-register** no later than **Tuesday, April 26, 2021** for lunch count. There is no registration fee, no exhibitor's number. Registration **Contact Person: Marie Bartlett.** (*information on page 1*)
2. The Rose Show will be staged in the **Holy Family Center St Rita Catholic Church.** The **preparation area will open at 7:00 a.m.** Entries will be accepted from 7:30 a.m. to 10:15 a.m. Judging will begin at 10:30 a.m.
3. **All entries and trophies** must remain in place until the show committee announces the show is to be taken down (2:45 or 3:00). This allows time for judges and exhibitors to view the complete show and take photos.
4. **All entries** must be grown in an outdoor garden by the exhibitor. Only one specimen of the same variety from the same garden is allowed in each class.
5. **Horticulture Judges** for this show may enter any arrangement classes not reserved or restricted.
6. **Arrangement Judges** for this show may enter any horticulture classes not reserved or restricted.
7. **All Gulf District Judges** for this show may enter photos in the Pete Haring classes which will be judged by a Photography Committee.
8. **Official Entry Tags** will be supplied and must be completed on both sections. Exhibitor's complete address is not necessary. No Exhibitor Numbers will be issued.
9. **Containers** will be furnished except where specifically indicated.
10. **Separate entry tags** identifying each cultivar are required for multiple container entries. Where the multiple entry is staged in one container, the longer challenge tags shall be used to list all cultivars.
11. **Challenge class entries** must be placed by the exhibitor. Once placed, the entry shall not be moved by anyone other than the exhibitor. Placement Committee will position all other horticulture entries.
12. **Wedging material** of exhibitor's choice may be used to position blooms. Penalization may be assessed if wedging material presents a distraction by its careless or excessive use.
13. **Specimens will be disqualified** for misnamed, misclassified or unlabeled
14. **Large-flowered climbers** labeled as (LCL) in the ARS *Handbook for Selecting Roses* are to be shown in the horticulture class for Large-Flowered Climbers. All other roses with "climbing" (CL) as part of their name must be shown in their respective bush-type class as though the word "climbing" did not appear in the name.
15. **Low-petaled varieties** will be exhibited with open blooms.
16. **The ARS Rules & Regulations** for exhibiting and judging will be followed.
17. The ARS Scale of points for judging roses in the horticultural division is as follows:

Form	25 points
Color	20 points
Substance	15 points
Stem & Foliage	20 points
Balance & Proportion	10 points
Size	<u>10 points</u>
TOTAL	100 points

DIVISION I - HORTICULTURE CLASSES

Section A – Gulf District Challenge Classes Use Challenge Class Entry Tags.

Open only to members of Rose Societies in the ARS Gulf District. **Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in each class provided different varieties are used.** The best in each Class will receive a keeper trophy if merited.

- Class A-1 J. HORACE MCFARLAND DISTRICT TROPHY** - Five Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora blooms; each a different variety; one bloom-per-stem; at exhibition stage. Exhibited in separate containers; each a separate tag.
- Class A-2 CARSON SCOGGINS MEMORIAL TROPHY** - Three Hybrid Tea blooms; one pink, one white, one red; may include blends; each a different variety; one bloom-per-stem; at exhibition stage. Exhibited in one container; one entry tag.
- Class A-3 MARJORIE M. CONN MEMORIAL TROPHY** - Seven Miniature blooms; the same variety; one bloom-per-stem; at exhibition stage. Exhibited in one container; one entry tag.
- Class A-4 RALPH S. MOORE DISTRICT AWARD** - Seven Miniature blooms; each a different variety; one bloom-per-stem; at exhibition stage. Exhibited in separate containers; separate entry tags.
- Class A-5 DR. HAROLD B. HAYDEN TROPHY** - Three floribunda sprays; each a different variety. Exhibited in separate containers; separate entry tags.
- Class A-6 HOWARD BERRY TROPHY** - Five Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora blooms; one variety; one bloom-per-stem at exhibition stage. Exhibited in one container; one entry tag.
- Class A-7 GRIFFITH BUCK TROPHY** - Three Shrub Roses displayed as one bloom-per-stem or a spray; each a different variety. Exhibited in separate containers; with separate tags.
- Class A-8 GULF DISTRICT ROSES OF THE YEAR** - Only roses that have been selected *Gulf District Rose of the Year* are eligible: 'Belinda's Dream' (2015), 'Cinco de Mayo' (2016), 'Mrs B R Cant' (2017), 'Julia Child' (2018), 'Veterans' Honor' (2019), 'Sweet Drift' (2020), "Peggy Martin" (2021). Exhibit as one bloom or as a spray; exhibit one or all varieties; each a separate entry; each a separate container; each a separate tag.
- Class A-9 CLAUDIUS A. MAYO TROPHY** - Three Old Garden Roses, each a different variety, single blooms and/or sprays. Exhibited in separate containers; with separate tags.
- Class A-10 JUDY MAYO MEMORIAL TROPHY** - A Traditional Arrangement. Designer's choice of Line, Line Mass or Mass Arrangement; using only fresh plant material; using standard or miniature roses; using arranger grown roses only. Will be judged by arrangement judges using point scoring. Must pre-register this entry as an arrangement. Use arrangement entry tag. Eligible exclusively for Judy Mayo Memorial Trophy.
- Class A-11 PETE HARING TROPHY** - Rose photography: 5x7 photo with or without mat. Matted frame (any color or shape) may not exceed 8x10. Maximum two entries per sub-class. Use challenge entry forms. Label class as A-11.1 - A-11.6. Best in each sub-class eligible for blue ribbon. A keeper trophy will be awarded to the best of the blue ribbon winners from all subclass listed below.
- A-11.1 – Photo of one bloom at exhibition form for that variety.
- A-11.2 – Photo of one spray of any variety.
- A-11.3 – Photo of one open bloom of any variety. Fresh stamens visible.
- A-11.4 – Photo of a rose arrangement. Credit must be given to the arranger.
- A-11.5 – Photo of a rose garden; showing roses within the structure of a garden. Roses should dominate.
- A-11.6 – Abstract or Impressionistic rose photo; demonstrating originality and creativity. May be an extreme close-up or an altered image using photo enhancement software such as water coloring, distorting, etc.

Section B - Challenge & Collection Classes Use Challenge Class Entry Tags.

Open to all exhibitors. Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in each class provided different varieties are used. Best in each class will receive a keeper trophy if merited.

- Class B-1** **Cycle of Bloom using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Three specimen of the same variety; one a bud, one an exhibition bloom, one an open bloom with stamens visible. Exhibited in separate containers; one tag .
- Class B- 2** **Cycle of Bloom using Old Garden Rose or Shrub** - Three specimen of the same variety; one a bud, one an exhibition bloom, one an open bloom with stamens visible. Exhibited in separate containers; one entry tag .
- Class B- 3** **Cycle of Bloom using Miniatures or Minifloras** - Three specimen of the same variety; one a bud, one an exhibition bloom, one an open bloom with stamens visible. Exhibited in separate containers; one tag .
- Class B- 4** **Matched Pair using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Same variety at the same stage of development; one bloom-per-stem. Exhibited in separate containers; one entry tag.
- Class B- 5** **Matched Pair using Old Garden Rose, Shrubs, Floribundas or LCL** - Same variety at the same stage of development; one bloom-per-stem. Exhibited in separate containers; one entry tag.
- Class B- 6** **Matched Pair using Miniatures or Minifloras** - Same variety at the same stage of development; one bloom-per-stem. Exhibited in separate containers; one entry tag.
- Class B- 7** **Rose in Bowl using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Open bloom; fresh stamens visible, without foliage, floating on clear water in a clear glass bowl furnished by show committee.
- Class B- 8** **Rose in Bowl using Old Garden Rose, Shrubs, Floribundas or LCL** - Open bloom; fresh stamens visible, without foliage, floating on clear water in a bowl furnished by show committee.
- Class B- 9** **Rose in Bowl using Miniature or Miniflora** - Open bloom; fresh stamens visible, without foliage, floating on clear water in a bowl furnished by show committee.
- Class B- 10** **English Box using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Any combination of six blooms; each at the same stage; no foliage showing. English Box provided by exhibitor or show committee. One entry tag.
- Class B- 11** **English Box using Old Garden Rose or Shrub** - Any combination of six blooms; each at the same stage; no foliage showing. English Box provided by exhibitor or show committee. One entry tag.
- Class B- 12** **English Box using Miniatures or Minifloras** - Any combination of six blooms; each at the same stage; no foliage showing. English Box provided by exhibitor or show committee. One entry tag.
- Class B- 13** **Artist's Palette using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Five blooms, five different varieties, each at the same stage, without foliage. Exhibited on artist palette. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 14** **Artist's Palette using Old Garden Rose or Shrub** - Five blooms, five different varieties, each at the same stage, without foliage. Exhibited on artist palette. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 15** **Artist's Palette using Miniatures or Minifloras** - Five blooms, five different varieties, each at the same stage, without foliage. Exhibited on artist palette. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 16** **Rose in a Frame using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - One bloom at its most perfect stage for this display; foliage permitted; displayed in an frame provided by exhibitor or show committee.
- Class B- 17** **Rose in a Frame using Old Garden Rose, Shrubs, Floribundas or LCL** - One bloom at its most perfect stage for this display; foliage permitted; displayed in a frame provided by exhibitor or show committee.
- Class B- 18** **Rose in a Frame using Miniatures or Minifloras** - One bloom at its most perfect stage for this display; foliage permitted; displayed in a frame provided by exhibitor or show committee.

Section B - Challenge & Collection Classes

- Class B- 19** **Collection of Blooms Using Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Six or more blooms exhibited in one *container provided by the exhibitor*. Blooms may be the same or mixed varieties. No other plant material may be used. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 20** **Collection of Old Garden Roses** - Six or more blooms exhibited in one *container provided by the exhibitor*. Blooms may be the same or mixed varieties. *No other plant material may be used*. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 21** **Collection of Shrubs** - Six or more blooms exhibited in one *container provided by the exhibitor*. Blooms may be the same or mixed varieties. *No other plant material to be used*. One entry tag listing each variety.
- Class B- 22** **Collection of Blooms using Miniatures or Minifloras** - Six or more blooms of any class. Blooms may be the same or mixed varieties. Exhibited in one *container provided by the exhibitor*. No other plant material may be used. One entry tag.
- Class B- 23** **Miniature or Miniflora Rose Basket**
Ten or more blooms in a basket; may be same or different varieties. Exhibited in *exhibitor's basket*. One entry tag listing each variety.

Challenge Classes Using Seedlings

- Class B-24** **Standard Seedlings Hybridized by the Exhibitor** - Any number of seedlings hybridized by the exhibitor; each a different variety; each displayed in a separate container; each with separate tags. Use "working-name" of rose including the parentage. (*Seedlings with unknown parentage exhibited in Class M-2*)
- Class B-25** **Miniature Seedlings Hybridized by the Exhibitor** - Any number of seedlings hybridized by the exhibitor; each a different variety; each displayed in a separate container; each with separate tags. Use "working-name" of rose including the parentage. (*Seedlings with unknown parentage exhibited in Class M-2*)



DIVISION I - HORTICULTURE CLASSES

Open to all exhibitors, except certain Sections which are designated for Small Gardens, Novices, Juniors or Judges. Unlimited entries exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class will receive a keeper trophy if merited.

Section C – *Hybrid Tea & Grandiflora*

Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in each class provided different varieties are used.

- Class C-1** **Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - Exhibited at exhibition stage. One bloom-per-stem.
Eligible for: Queen of Show – King of Show – Princess of Show
Top three receive a keeper Trophy. Court of Honor – Six (6)
- Class C-2** **Open Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - One bloom-per-stem; fresh stamens visible.
Includes singles and low-petaled varieties (5-12 petals).
- Class C-3** **Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora Spray** - Multiple blooms-per-stem; with or without buds.
- Class C-4** **Decorative Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora** - One bloom at exhibition form for that variety; Only hybrid teas or grandifloras which *do not typically product a high, pointed, symmetrical, spiraled center*, but rather *typically displays an informal flat or cupped symmetrical configuration*, are eligible for this award.

Section D – *Miniature*

Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in each class provided different varieties are used.

- Class D-1** **Miniature** - Exhibited at exhibition stage. One bloom-per-stem.
Eligible for: Miniature Queen of Show – Miniature King of Show –Miniature Princess of Show
Top three receive a keeper Trophy. Miniature Court – Six (6)
- Class D-2** **Open Miniature** - One bloom-per-stem at fully opened stage with fresh stamens visible.
Includes singles and low-petaled varieties (5-12 petals).
- Class D-3** **Miniature Spray** - Multiple blooms-per-stem; with or without buds.

Section E – *Miniflora*

Exhibitors are allowed more than one entry in each class provided different varieties are used.

- Class E-1** **Miniflora** - Exhibited at exhibition stage. One bloom-per-stem.
Eligible for: Miniflora Queen of Show – Miniflora King of Show –Miniflora Princess of Show
Top three receive a keeper Trophy. Miniflora Court – Six (6)
- Class E-2** **Open Miniflora** - One bloom-per-stem at fully opened stage with fresh stamens visible.
Includes singles and low-petaled varieties (5-12 petals).
- Class E-3** **Miniflora Spray** - Multiple blooms-per-stem; with or without buds.

SECTION F – *Old Garden Roses*

****Follow specific rules for each class.**

Unlimited entries in each class exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class receives a trophy if merited.

Class F-1 Old Garden Rose Variety Introduced prior to 1867 - Eligible for Dowager Queen Certificate
Exhibited as one bloom or as a spray; OGRs may be exhibited stem-on-stem.
**** Helpful to state date of introduction on entry tag.**

Class F-2 Old Garden Rose Introduced In or After 1867 (or unknown) - Eligible for Victorian Queen Certificate
Exhibited as one bloom or as a spray.
**** Helpful to state date of introduction on entry tag.**

SECTION G – *Shrub*

****Follow specific rules for each class.**

Unlimited entries in each class exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class receives a trophy if merited.

Class G-3 Classic Shrub

One bloom per stem or a spray. Classic shrubs includes roses classified as hybrid musk (HMsk), hybrid kordesii (HKor), hybrid moyesii (HMoy) and hybrid rugosa (HRg).

Classification is listed with the rose name in the ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses.

****Helpful to state specific classic shrub classification on tag.**

Class G-4 Modern Shrub

One bloom per stem or a spray. Modern shrubs includes English Roses (David Austin), Buck, and other shrubs. *Modern shrubs are classified as S (shrub) in ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses.*

****Helpful to state classification as Shrub on entry tag.**

SECTION H – *Climbers*

Unlimited entries exhibiting different varieties. Best of class receives a trophy if merited.

Class H-5 Climbers

May be exhibited as one bloom or as a spray. Must be classed as Large Flowered Climber (LCL), Hybrid Wichurana (HWich) or Hybrid Gigantea (HG). Varieties classed as CI HTs, CL Min, etc must be exhibited with their non-climbing class. **** Helpful to state specific climbing classification on entry tag.**

SECTION I – *Floribunda*

Unlimited entries in each class exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class will receive a trophy if merited.

Class I-1 Floribunda Spray - Multiple blooms-per-stem; with or without buds.
Eligible for Floribunda Queen, Floribunda King and Floribunda Princess - each receiving a trophy.

Class I-2 Floribunda Bloom - One bloom; without side buds.

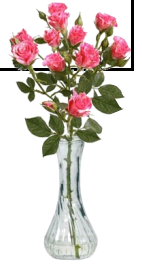
SECTION J – *Polyantha*

Unlimited entries in each class exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class will receive a trophy if merited.

Class J-1 Polyantha Spray - Multiple blooms-per-stem; with or without buds.

SECTION K – *Cenla Rose Society Small Garden Challenge*

Open only to Cenla Rose Society members with 50 bushes or less. Unlimited entries exhibiting different varieties. Exhibitors with small gardens may also exhibit in other classes. Best in each class will receive a keeper trophy.



(spray)

Class K-1 Bloom - One standard bloom of any rose variety.

Class K-2 Miniature or Miniflora Bloom - One bloom or one spray of a Miniature or Miniflora.

Class K-3 Spray - One stem with multiple blooms; any variety including miniatures.

SECTION L – *Novice and Junior Classes*

Open to anyone who has never won a blue ribbon in an American Rose Society rose show. Also open to anyone 21 years old or younger. Novices and juniors may also enter in the regular competitive classes. Unlimited entries exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class will receive a keeper trophy.

Class L-1 One Bloom
One standard bloom of any rose variety.

Class L-2 Spray
One stem with multiply blooms; any rose variety including miniatures.

Class L-3 Miniature or Miniflora Bloom
One bloom-per-stem.

SECTION M – *Special Classes*

Unlimited entries exhibiting different varieties. Best in each class will receive a keeper trophy.

Class M-1 Found Roses - One bloom or one spray of any variety rose labeled "Found" or listed within quotation marks in the *ARS Handbook For Selecting Roses* or *ARS Modern Roses*. Example: "Peggy Martin", "Maggie"

Class M-2 Seedlings - One bloom or one spray of any variety seedling discovered or grown from seed with unknown parentage. Unlimited entries; each a different variety. Use "working name" of each variety on entry tag. (Enter known parentage seedlings in Class B-24.)

Class M-3 Most Fragrant Rose - Any variety rose at any stage; judged by all present to determine most fragrant rose.

SECTION N – *Classes for Display Only*

Unlimited entries of different varieties.

No trophies, no ribbons, no judging, no excuse not to show your blooms.

Class N-1 Who's Your Mama - Unknown Name Roses - Display pass-along roses with unknown name. Label with name you gave to the rose. ("Grandma's Rose", "Mystery Rose", etc) Perhaps someone will be able to identify your rose/s. One opened entry-tag for each different variety; your name showing.

Class N-2 Any Rose Variety - Display named roses not entered for judging. Display your extra roses, singles or sprays, or your roses with less than perfect foliage or bloom. Exhibit your roses to help make a beautiful display of colorful roses for the Rose Show. One opened entry-tag for each variety; rose name and your name showing.

SECTION O – Challenge Classes for Horticulture Judges of this show

Unlimited entries in each class; Best in each Judges' Challenge Class will receive a Lowe's gift certificate.

This class will be judged by Horticulture Judges not exhibiting in this class.

****All Gulf District judges in this show may enter photos in the District Pete Haring Challenge Class.**

Class O-1 Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora

One bloom at exhibition stage.

Class O-2 Miniatures or Minifloras

One bloom at exhibition stage.

Class O-3 Floribunda Spray

One stem with two or more blooms.

Class O-4 Old Garden Rose

One bloom or spray.

Class O-5 Shrub

One bloom or spray.

Class O-6 Rose in a Bowl

Any standard variety.

Class O-7 Collection of Blooms

Six or more blooms of any class including miniatures. Blooms may be the same or a mixed variety. Exhibited in one *container provided by the exhibitor*. One entry tag listing each variety.
